# Recycle

Oh, glorious Spring! Some good news to report after last month's revelations about the sham happening within the recycling industry in Florida, here is positivity to spur our Garden Club's recycling efforts forward. Even though our part in this effort may be miniscule in changing the degradation and pollution of Mother Earth, every bit will help.

If compostable plastic bags sound like a great idea, here is a source for you to review. Visit this website to see what they offer. Cleanomicesstentials.com

Coca Cola Company, Keurig, Dr. Pepper and Pepsi Company are designing fully recyclable plastic bottles. More than 100% recyclable by allowing old bottles to be made into new ones, so that they stay out of landfills and our environment.

There is now a certain bacterium that can eat non-biodegradable plastic and turn it into PHA, an eco-friendly biodegradable plastic! These tiny microbes and their plastic-munching abilities could help alleviate our fight against plastic pollution.

Recycling Technologies is a company attempting to turn plastic back into its original form - oil. The process is known as depolymerization.

Keep using plastic cups, not paper cups when you can. Remember everything must be wiped clean as possible - no grease or gunk on paper plates, plastic cutlery, etc. Here is the last of the recycling center's rules - no 50/50 tickets in with paper. There is a "green transitioning" going on right now on earth. Green technology will supply many new jobs for our children and grandchildren in years to come. Let's do our part now.
